Reading Week

Reading festival

Last newsletter I wrote about the reading festival and so I would like to remind you of some of the key associated events. The festival begins on Wednesday 5th November and ends the following Monday. Each morning of the festival parents are welcome to join their children from 8.30am for fifteen minutes of reading. On Wednesday 5th November the children will do a round robin of reading events. They will be based in their houses and so mixed across the school and will move around during the day. One of the activities will be a forest school based activity and so please could all children bring in their forest school clothes on that day.

On Monday 10th November the children are invited to dress up as their favourite character from a book and bring their book with them. In the afternoon of that day, some of the children will take part in a debate in front of the rest of the school. In the evening of Monday 10th the children are invited back for our popular book at bedtime. They can come in at 6:30 pm with a cushion and (if they want to) in their pyjamas to share in a story with their class teacher. There will also be a mug of hot chocolate for them to enjoy. The session will finish at 7:15 pm. At the same time we will host a short reading curriculum evening which is a chance for parents to find out a bit more about how we teach reading in the school. We have combined the two events so that it allows you to drop off your children at the book at bedtime event and then attend the information session in the hall. The curriculum session will also run between 6:30 - 7:15 pm.

As part of the reading festival the children in each class will learn to retell a story or a piece of non-fiction. On Monday 17th November you are invited to come to the school hall at 2:15pm and see the children recite their pieces.

Over half term it will be excellent if you can get a photo or two of extreme reading (you are welcome to submit photos of adults as well as children!) and also help your child think of their favourite author or book and how to convince others of their choice. Additionally, don't forget to have a think about a costume.

Yesterday the children were given a leaflet about the Travelling Book Fair. The fair will arrive at school on Tuesday 4th November and will be up and running from Wednesday 5th. It will be in school for you to shop at until the following Tuesday. We hold the fair every two years, which is a great way for you to select a new book or two with your child and possibly stock up on Christmas presents! In the past it has been a brilliant way for the school to earn commission, which then gets used to buy more books for our library. The book fair runs for half an hour or so after school each day. Last year Mrs Anslow did an excellent job at running the fair and so we are looking for any parents who might be willing to help each day or on a rota basis.
