# **Reading Award System**

Thank you to all the children for their great efforts and work during the Reading Festival and also to all the parents who came to the reading information evening. It was great to see such a good turn out and I really hope that you found it useful. If you would like any more information or guidance on reading with your children at home please come in and see your child's teacher. The PowerPoint presentation that I showed, along with some resources are on our new school website.

As I explained in a previous newsletter, we are really trying to improve the reading and comprehension of the children in school this year, and the reading festival is just one of the many ways that we have already put into place. As I said during the information evening children reading at home to an adult is absolutely pivotal in the development of their reading. We have launched a new award system to encourage them to read to you or another adult at home. Every time a child reads at home to an adult (and their reading diary had been signed!) children can colour in a square on their class chart. As they read more and more the children are able to win awards. The first milestone is 50 signed reading experiences (which should be achievable in about 12 weeks. Upon completion of that, the children get a certificate. As they read more and more at home, the awards increase in size from a wristband all the way up to the children receiving a book! I really hope that you can help your children in their quest to work their way up through the prizes whilst at the same time improving their reading, comprehension and enjoying the experience. Remember, this is about the number of times that the children are reading rather than the number of books that they have read so that children who are reading longer and more complex books are not disadvantaged.

## **Christmas related things**

It is such a busy time of year that I thought that it would be good to have a recap on some of the festive events that are coming up.

Tomorrow (Friday 28th) we have mufti day for the children. In order to take part the children need to bring in something for the chocolate tombola at the Christmas fair. On **Monday 8th December** the Christmas Postbox will be available for the children to post their Christmas cards to each other.

Our KS1 Nativity afternoon performance is on **Tuesday 9th** December and will start 1.45pm. The evening performance is on **Thursday 11th** December at 6:00pm. We will also hold a dress rehearsal on **Monday 8th December** at 9:30 am, which is an ideal opportunity for parents with younger children to come and see the performance.


