Where has the year gone? It went so quickly! What a fantastic year it has been.

**RESULTS** - The school results that have come in so far (although not validated yet) have been very good and most well above the national. We are so proud of all our children - a huge well done to all! Remember that we are a small school and 1 pupil can alter the % quite a large amount and that all pupils and cohorts of children are different. National scores are based on 2016 results.
