Multi Academy Trust - As we are drawing nearer to the 1<sup>st</sup> April, the governors and I thought it would be good to clarify and explain about the MAT so that it reassures and also answers any last minute questions.

It has been known for many years that schools working closely together tend to do better than those who are isolated. By 'doing better' we mean can share good practice, share resources as well as support and challenge each other and this can lead to improvement of opportunities for children and staff.

As tighter budgets are hitting local authorities, cut backs to school have been inevitable, and although we are lucky as we are federated and already have savings on some shared staff, we are having to be more careful year on year. Working together with other schools in a MAT will enable savings on office staff such as finance, payroll and administration, pooling resources and purchasing on equipment, and utility bills, and finally sharing expertise within staffing for training and development.

Two years ago all the head teachers and chairs of governors of Cirencester schools met to discuss ways of working together and parties interested in joining together to be a multi academy trust have worked together. Each school has its own needs and aspirations and it has worked out that Cirencester Deer Park School, Kemble and Siddington Schools were ready to embark on this project first. Chesterton Primary School are also joining us from September. We are expecting that in the future another couple of schools will join us.

Since the initial meetings, a group of representatives from each school and local community members have been meeting to move the project forward. Consultations took place with parents, other community members and groups and all responses were positive. Due diligence was carried out on each school and as reported through my newsletters, the DfE approved our applications - with a very strong endorsement. The thorough work carried out over the past two years showed that we had considered all options and scenarios and prepared well.

From 1<sup>st</sup> April, the schools will work in exactly the same way that they do now. I will still be the executive head teacher across the two schools and there will be senior leaders in each school, Mrs Hamlett at Siddington and Mrs Newton's replacement at Kemble. They, as now, will deal with the general day to day running aspects when I am not on site and will be the first port of call for parents and children.

Our Multi Academy Trust - to be called 'Corinium Education Trust' (CET) will oversee the schools within it just as the Local Authority has. The Diocese will still oversee Siddington as a Church of England school and have representation at each level. Our governors will still be responsible for the school ethos, the quality of teaching and learning, staff appointment and performance management, pupil disciplinary panels, admission appeals and uniform. A Trustees Board, made up of local community members will oversee performance of the schools, statutory and legal compliance, financial control, risk, premises, HR, health and safety and the MAT development. 'Above' the trustee board there is a member's board who are responsible for the appointment of the trustees, approval of annual accounts and appointment of external auditors.

The trustee board represent a range of expertise: Graham Russell - business, Charles Woodd - finance and pensions, Susannah Gilbert - Compliance, Claire Mould - charities and social care, Jane Lloyd - primary education (our vice chair of governors) and Chiquita Henson - secondary education.

From a pupil perspective, there will be no change to uniform, logo or learning. But we hope to be able to offer additional opportunities to the curriculum when we have settled into the CET structure and staff start working more closely together. And be reassured, parents and children can choose any secondary school education as now. Exciting times!
