Mrs Janvrin has informed us that she will not be returning to teaching at Kemble, we are sad to see her go, but understand her wish to spend time with her lovely family! We are currently recruiting and will confirm what is happening as soon as possible.

VISION & OUR VALUE - RESPECT - As part of our vision and values work this year, we will be focussing on looking after each other and our lovely schools, continuing with our 'Kindfulness Kites' and making sure that we continue our work on the 3 things that have once again been highlighted in the news as problems young people are facing:

- 1. MENTAL HEALTH we will continue our work on good mental health, using a range of resources in our personal, health, social, health education (PHSE) lessons. See the leaflet and share with children to encourage them to think about how they can improve their mental health children designed these
- 2. HEALTHY DIET we will encourage children to choose and eat healthily, this aims to re-

duce sugar and salt intake in line with government recommendations. Tuck shop will continue, but we will make sure it is positioned away from exits from school and offer healthier choices too. Also - if your child has a birthday at school, please try to offer healthier options rather than just sweets, maybe a pencil or little toy, or even something that can be enjoyed by all the children in class or at school; a game or piece of equipment for the playground would be super and different!



3. INTERNET SAFETY - we want children to think about internet safety, and cyber bullying every time they are online and also how they can manage social media so that they do not suffer from anxiety or depression.

MARKING - In June, staff trialled a no-marking month to see if there was any change on pupil progress. Staff have reported that children did just as well with verbal feedback as with written comments in books, in some cases directly chatting with the children and talking and showing them examples using the visualiser, had better impact than with traditional book marking and this has been trialled with similar results by government studies. Staff will adapt their feedback in books and in lessons over the coming months to make sure that children make the best progress.

KPG- Our wonderful parent groups have raised substantial amounts of money in the past few years and this has enabled the school to provide lots of fun and educational equipment for the children, subsidise or pay for trips and visits for the children and provide experiences such as the Life Education Caravan or Christmas theatre trip. Over the next few weeks, the parent groups will be meeting and wanting to 'recruit' new members. The groups are social and have good fun so please support them - children are the ones who benefit - thank you.

TOILETS - You may notice that we have new flooring in the corridor by Horse Chestnut and Chestnut class, and in the toilets. With the new flooring, the smell has gone and we will try once again to make sure the toilets stay fresh and clean. The issue in the past has been urine on the floor on a regular basis. Please would you let staff know if your child cannot comfortably use an adult size toilet. If anyone has a toilet 'step up' that they no longer need, then please let the office staff know as we would like one for each toilet (4 in total) thank you.

EVENTS FOR THE YEAR - An events calendar will be issued with this letter and will be available on the school website. Please keep the copy of the events calendar safe as this has the main dates and times of events through the whole year. We like to give parents as much notice as possible. Occasionally we do have to cancel or change dates, but we try to keep to our original dates if we can
