WELLBEING & RESILIENCE RESOURCES - A message from Mrs Morrogh-Ryan

addressing the issues around supporting your child. The focus was on our understanding of resilience and appreciating its importance for well-being, finding ways to encourage children to manage their feelings and exploring what they can do for themselves and helping them to realise when they need support. We know many of you were not able to attend and we are now able to share the resources given at the evening. I do hope you find them of interest and would be happy to discuss any concerns / questions you have. Please do keep an eye on the website for more PSHE resources and information. ATTENDANCE - Please can we remind parents that taking time off during the term is not authorised unless families have an exceptional circumstance such as a death or serious illness in the family, services families who need to take time off together before or after a tour or other circumstances that are unusual. We cannot authorise holidays at any time during the term. The DfE set a target of 100% attendance and the normal time off for illness is usually only 3%, so children should be able to attend at least 97% of the time. It has been found that children who have time off over 5% may not do as well academically due to lost

HEALTHY EATING / PUBLIC HEALTH ENGLAND (PHE) - Each year the National

Child Measurement Programme takes place. Children in the Reception class and in Year 6 are measured and the statistics from each school are noted. No children are named or mentioned, but this is a way for statistics to be gathered. PHE let schools know what our children are measured at compared to the National average. Our

school cohorts were too small last year, but local statistics were:

23% of Reception children are obese or overweight in Gloucestershire compared to 22% in England

32% of Year 6 children are obese or overweight in Gloucestershire compared to 34% in England



In order to help children keep healthy, please try not to allow sugary snacks such as biscuits, cake or sweets in between meals - maybe keep them for a once per week treat. Teach children to carry out an active hobby such as daily walking, cycling or a sport. School helps with keeping children healthy by offering good quality meals that follow the school meal guidance, teaching children about healthy choices in PHSCE and by encouraging daily exercise (the daily mile or Wake & Shake type activities) and encouraging children taking up a sport through our after school clubs. If you think your child is overweight or becoming overweight and you need help to manage this, then please come and speak to a teacher or Mrs Rogers our PE lead or Mrs Morrogh-Ryan our PHSCE lead

MATHLETICS AND SPELLODROME As you are probably aware all children in Years 1 - 6 have access to the online learning sites Mathletics and Spellodrome from 3P learning.

These are both fantastic sites to encourage regular practise of key maths concepts and spelling patterns and key words. In order to help parents become more aware of how their children are doing, there is the option of setting up a regular weekly email update. This is free and easy to do and will send you a weekly report on progress, improvement and time spent online. In order to register you will need your child's log on details and visit the site www.mathletics.com/parent. PARENT PAY—Thank you for all moving over to Parent Pay. We hope you are finding it easier to pay for trips and ASC and BC. You can deposit a sum for each of these items, say £25 into your ASC and/or BC account and then when each time your child uses ASC, or BC the relevant sum is taken from this amount. You do not have to pay for each session individually. BUT, you have to allocate the money to the right area, for example you cannot allocate one sum to cover dinners, trips, ASC and BC.
