

Magical maths:

Part of our school development is to develop maths progress across all year groups. An analysis of the SATS papers and end of year and term assessments show that we have a few children who do still find the basics hard to grasp. In class,



after lunch, children come in and are engaged in maths tasks for 10 minutes, which can include re-capping from the morning if they were stuck on the learning, going over times tables or number bonds, or working with a friend on a maths challenge. The times table testing is being initiated next May for Year 4 children and in order to prepare we are giving children lots of opportunities to play with number! I know that sometimes the Mathletics website struggles on certain tablets, but if you want to have a go at some new things, try these websites:

The best advice is to only allow children up to 12 to use devices in a room where an adult is present - that way you can check to make sure children only access age appropriate material and that they are not being groomed.
